Dense purple displays notes of charcoal, toast, blackberry liqueur, graphite and licorice. Dense and full-bodied, this silky-textured, impressively endowed wine is long and quite thick, finishing accessible with promise for cellaring for 15-20 years. Among the most picturesque properties of Médoc, Bernard Magrez's La Tour Carnet dates to the 12th century, producing top-flight Bordeaux. A blend of 62% Cabernet Sauvignon, 35% Merlot, and the remainder Petit Verdot and Cabernet Franc.

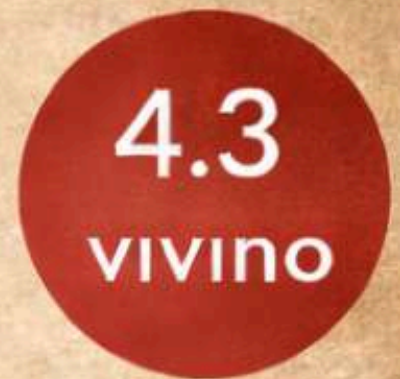

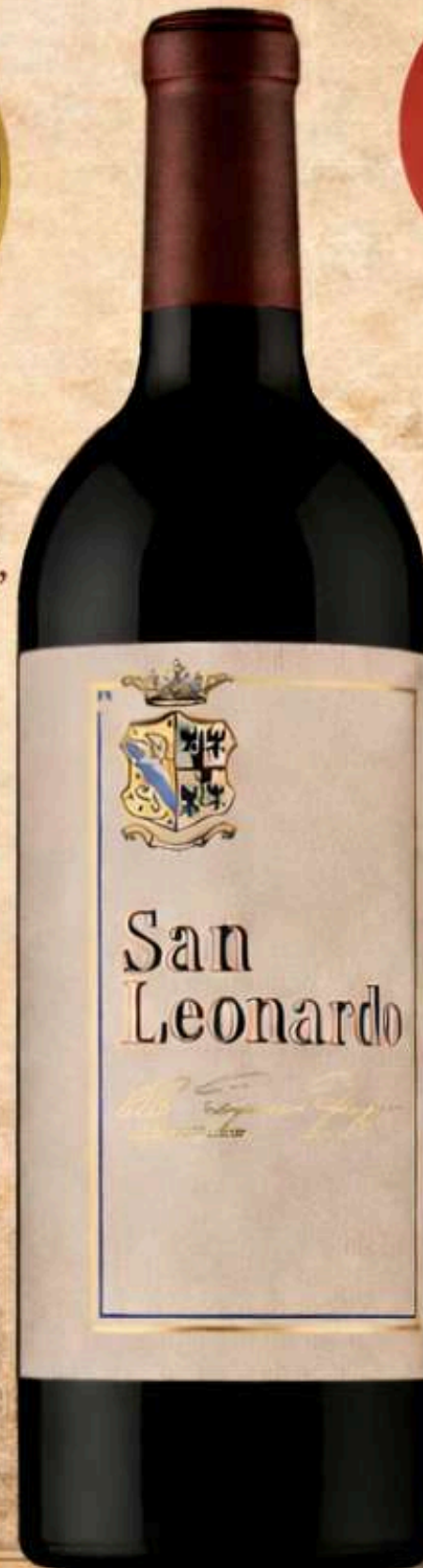
